

ST. SWITHIN

- More correctly *St. Swithun*, was an Anglo-Saxon bishop of Winchester.
- In 971 his bones were removed to an indoor shrine at Winchester Cathedral and the forty days of rain thereafter was said to be the result of his weeping at such mistreatment of his remains.
- St. Swithin's was the name of the fictional London teaching hospital in Richard Gordon's books and the subsequent film and television adaptations. To my mind the most enduring character remains Sir Lancelot Spratt, played to perfection by James Robertson-Justice, and whose like were still very much a feature of my own medical training in London during the late 80's and early 90's (Ed.).



1 In July John Grant and I have been invited by Andrea Leadsom to a Teams meeting concerning an update on the Bypass Business Plan. This meeting will also be attended by our Ward Councillors, WNC Cabinet Members for Highways along with Highways Officers.

2 We understand that the final draft of business plan should be ready for perusal at a second meeting in August.

3 We also understand that the August meeting will also include interim measures with further discussion concerning our earlier application asking for a Weight Limit to be considered prior to any progress with the Bypass.

The Bypass Business Plan was supposed to be prepared in March then delayed to May with what was described as "slippage" so fingers crossed for August.

Many of you will probably have noticed deterioration of the surface of the A422 within the village mostly caused by Heavy Goods Vehicles—These include the noisy manhole covers reoccurring at the junction of Chapel Lane, gutter sinkage and breakup stretching from the driveway of Little <u>Farfield</u> past the pinch-point to Manor Lane and more breakup close to the Allotment Bus Shelter—REPORTED AND NEWS AWAITED.

VANILLA FRIDGE BISCUITS

Ingredients

(Makes 45)

225g (8oz) plain flour

1 tsp baking powder

110g (4oz) butter

175g (6oz) caster sugar

1 tsp vanilla extract

1 egg, beaten

Instructions

1. Stir together flour and baking powder.

2. Rub in butter. Add sugar.

3. Mix to a dough with vanilla and beaten egg.

4. Shape into a long sausage. Transfer to a length of foil.

5. Wrap foil round 'sausage' and twist ends.

6. Work backwards and forwards to form a roll about 5cm (2in) in diameter.

7. Refrigerate for 1 hour.

8. Thinly slice as many biscuits as required from roll (store remainder in the fridge for up to a week).

9. Place on a greased baking sheet, well apart, and bake at 190 degrees C

(170 degrees fan)/Gas mark 5 for 10-12 minutes or until pale gold.

CIDER CAKE

Ingredients

150ml (1/4 pint) dry cider
225g (8oz) sultanas
110g (4oz) butter
110g (4oz) light soft brown sugar
2 eggs, beaten
225g (8oz) plain flour
1tsp bicarbonate of soda

Instructions

- 1. Grease and line an 18cm (7in) square cake tin.
- 2. Soak cider and sultanas in a bowl overnight.
- 3. Cream butter and sugar until pale and fluffy, gradually add

eggs, beating well. Add half flour and all bicarbonate of soda and mix.

4. Add cake mixture to cider and sultanas and mix. Fold in remaining flour and pout into tin.

5. Bake at 180 degrees C (160 degrees fan)/Gas mark 4 for 45-60 minutes, until well risen.

6. Cool and turn out on to a wire cooling rack.
