CORONATION FACTS

His Majesty King Charles III is a man of many talents, including:

- Musician The King has learnt to play the piano, trumpet and cello.
- Scholar He was the first heir to the throne to earn a University degree.
- Pilot His Majesty obtained his RAF wings as Flight Lieutenant Wales in August 1971.
- Naval Officer The King commanded HMS Bronington in 1976.
- Paratrooper His Majesty was the first member of The Royal Family to successfully complete the Parachute Regiment's training course and has been Colonel-in-Chief of the Regiment since 1977.
- Magician In 1975, His Majesty became a member of the Magic Circle.
- Actor The King has made cameo appearances in both Coronation Street and EastEnders.
- Artist The King is a keen painter and had a watercolour displayed in the Royal Academy's 1987 summer exhibition, after it was submitted anonymously.
- Author Perhaps most famously, *The Old Man of Lochnagar* was based on stories he told his brothers growing up. However, the King has also written books on the natural world and the environment including *Harmony*; and *Climate Change*, a *Ladybird Expert Book*.
- Equestrian Although perhaps best known for his exploits on the polo field, His Majesty rode in the Ludlow steeplechase in 1980 finishing second.
- Environmentalist The King first spoke publicly about his concerns on pollution and plastics and their impact on the natural world in 1970.

Home to School Transport Consultation

We would like to know your views on changes we are proposing to our Home to School Transport service. These changes are required to meet increased demand and operating costs, whilst also exploring opportunities to give greater flexibility for parents, support our young people's independence and help to promote sustainable travel.

This is part of a larger review of transport policies, including Post-16. A consultation of the Post-16 policy will take place later this year, following a full review of bus services.

The changes we are proposing in this current consultation will not come into effect until September 2024, and focuses on a set of proposals, as well as providing opportunity to feedback on transport arrangements and a Draft Home to School Education Transport Policy (September 2024 to July 2025).

This consultation closes midnight Tuesday 30 May 2023.


