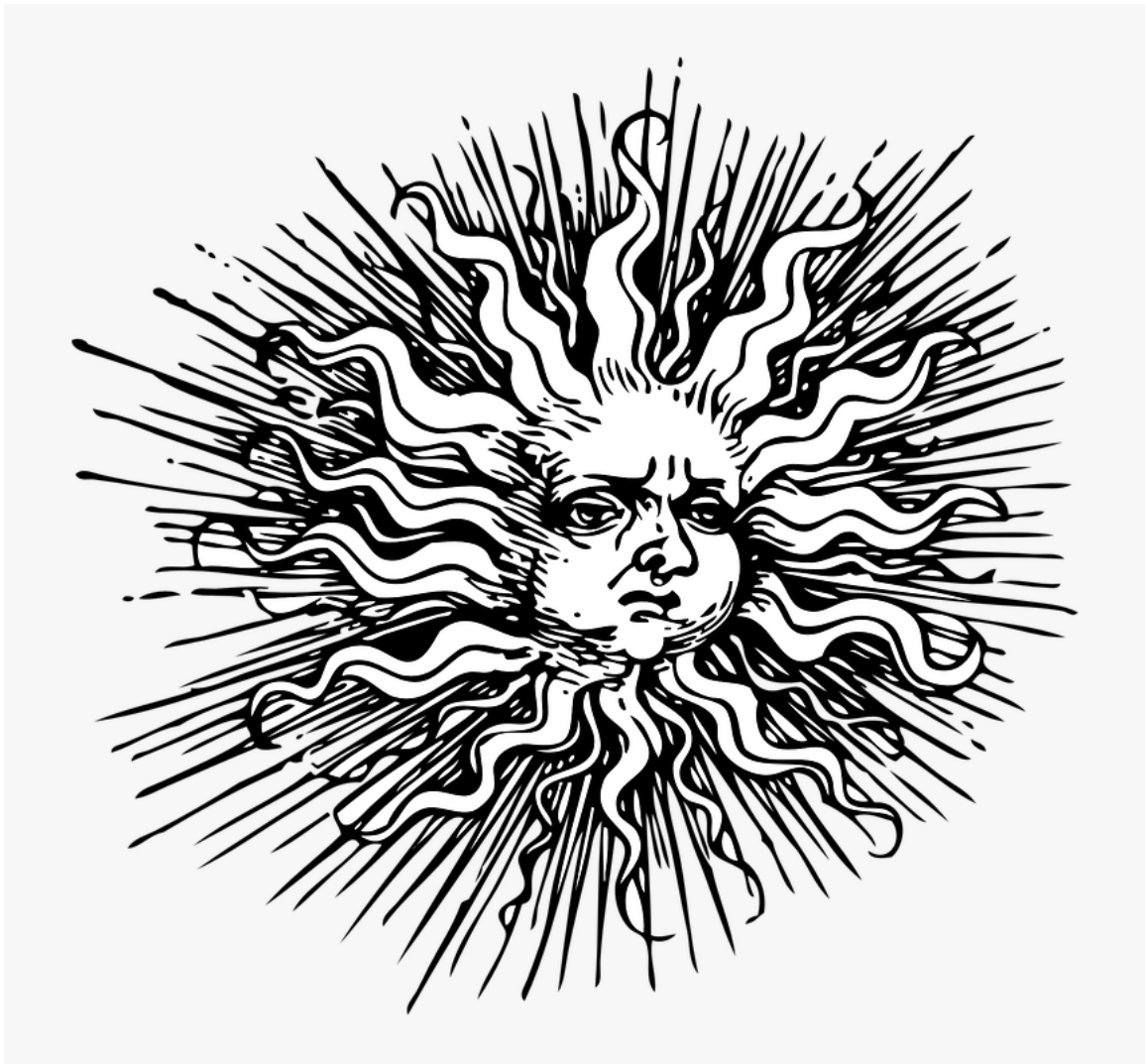

All Residents, please see the following information from STAGECOACH concerning the new 500 bus timetable from June 4th Banbury -Brackley-Bicester:

We're making improvements to services in Banbury from Sunday 4th June

affecting services 200, 500, B9, S4 and the 505 to Bicester and Brackley

We'll be making some changes to our timetables in Banbury from Sunday 4th June 2023 to improve reliability and punctuality.

Services affected: 200, 500, B9, S4 and 505

The timetables for services 200, 500 and B9 have been designed to provide a combined frequency of up to every 15 minutes between Banbury Town Centre, Middleton Road and Ermont Way.

The 500 will also operate a new route around Brackley and extend to Bicester every hour replacing service 505.

As you can see our bus now extends to Bicester and late evening busses have been reinstated

BRUSH UP YOUR SHAKESPEARE!!

On Saturday 1st July 2023 @ 7.30pm, Broadway comes to Brackley, when Brackley Jubilee Choir present an exciting Summer Broadway Musical Extravaganza; 'BRUSH UP YOUR SHAKESPEARE' at the Egerton Hall, Brackley, with Choral Medleys from 'KISS ME, KATE', WEST SIDE STORY' and George Shearing's – Shakespeare's SONGS and SONNETS.

Shakespeare's literary masterpieces, Romeo and Juliet and The Taming of the Shrew have provided the inspiration for the memorable and much loved songs and music for the Broadway productions of both Cole Porter's 'KISS ME, KATE', first performed in Dec 1948, and Leonard Bernstein's, 'WEST SIDE STORY' which opened in September 1957. George Shearing's later 1999 production of 'SONGS and SONNETS', again endorsed the influence of Shakespeare on modern composers and these musicals have continued to thrill audiences since their earliest inception.

Chair of Brackley Jubilee Choir, Auriel Warwick said: "This concert is taking place in an alternative venue to the usual St Peter's Church, Brackley, and we are delighted to be able to perform a lighter music programme at Brackley's newest events venue, Egerton Hall, located right at the heart of Brackley's most recent community development at Radstone Fields"
